



The District Governor Story - Part 1

Hello Rotary family. This past week I really felt like the District Governor Journey was in full



gear as I attended the **Rotary International** Assembly in Orlando, Florida from Sunday through Thursday. In attendance were 493 District Governors Elect from around the world as well as all Rotary International Directors and Rotary Foundation Trustees; there were lots of staff from Rotary Headquarters including our favourite, our Club and District Support person, Sophie Dangerfield. Each day was packed with keynote speakers and break out sessions that challenged our minds and

expanded our thinking about how we do Rotary. This was world class learning and I'll be

bringing back many great ideas to our district and our district leaders in the upcoming President Elect learning sessions.

Making connections with fellow District Governors Elect was key. I managed to find the DGE of the district where our next International Ski fellowship trip will take place in Japan (thank you google translate!). I connected with the DGE for Cambodia and the Dominican Republic where I oversee projects. I spent a lot of time with DGE of districts right next to us (5370 to the north and 5550 to the east). Most of the time it felt like I was at the United Nations as our breakout sessions would include many nations. As an example my last break out session had DGEs from Nigeria, USA Denmark Pakistan United Kingdom Phillipines Iceland and India). I connected with the DGE from Hungary and reignited my own cultural heritage.

This year RI tried something new: they grouped us in cohorts with other distant Districts. My cohort included the United Kingdom, the USA, Puerto Rico and Uruguay. We were challenged with doing fun activities (flag puzzles, paper cranes, lego animals). It may sound easy but when you have to deal with multiple languages things get tricky very quickly! Of course every time I bumped into Leonel (Uruguay) or Dawn (USA) or Luz (Puerto Rico), we would recognize each other and say hello, how are you doing? It made this overwhelming assembly a little more friendlier and enhanced the feeling of connectivity.

I am really looking forward to bringing vision and leadership to our district which, by the way, keeps increasing it's membership numbers. We are on the upswing! Why is that so important? That's a good questions and one which we explored at length at the Assembly. The bottom line is this: to do more, to have a great impact in the lives of people in our community and abroad, we simply need more people to be engaged at a level that works for them.

Now more than ever, the world needs Rotary as together, in all that we do for our communities right here at home and around the world, we unite for good and that is just the right thing to do.
